

LADWP employees assigned to a position requiring safety shoes may participate in this program. The vendors listed below provide discounted pricing for the purchase of safety shoes and equipment that can then be repaid in three convenient payroll deductions.

### **Guidelines:**

- Your supervisor must complete an authorization form allowing you to purchase shoes under this program. An application provided by the vendor must also be completed at the time of purchase to authorize automatic payroll deduction
- A maximum of two pairs of safety shoes can be purchased in any twelve month period
- Twelve pairs of socks may be purchased along with each shoe purchase, up to a limit of twentyfour pairs in any twelve month period
- Please check with your supervisor for a list of program approved equipment


